- Prizes:** Trophies to Top 5 and Top 3 Teams in each section (CSCA records will reflect Top Elementary, Middle and High School players by school designation, Top K and 1)
- NNGP Candidate:** Overall top CT player receives NGTC Candidate status and entry in the CSCA National Nominations Candidates Tournament on March 30, 2019 (see http://www.chessct.org/cscs/Uploads/NNGP_Rules_2018-19.pdf for NNGP rules and information.)
- Entry price:** \$40 on or before January 18;
\$50 on or before January 24;
\$70 on-site – exact change, cash only
- USCF Rated in Open section.
Non-CT players welcome and fully prize eligible, except NGTC status.

- (1) Event proceeds will benefit Connecticut scholastic chess development.

- (3) Award ceremony is anticipated by 4:30 PM for lower sections.
- (4) Participation certificates will be distributed to all players.
- (5) All players receive CSCA membership. Membership expires one year from event. Repeat participants in 2019 CSCA events extend membership to 1 year from most recent participation. CSCA Membership available on site for non-players, only \$5 per year.

About the Organizer

Connecticut Chess Organization is a non-profit project founded by Thomas Hartmayer and Alexander Lumelsky in summer 2015. Since then, CCO raised thousands of dollars and donated chess equipment, provided financial assistance for chess programs and students in need, reduced and waived entry fees to state-level tournaments, funded USCF memberships for players in need, created, organized and supported over 25 scholastic state-level chess tournaments, supported and funded the Connecticut State Chess Association (the Connecticut State Affiliate to US Chess) and its organizers, advocated for Connecticut scholastic players' and parents' rights at the state and national levels, organized and funded a half-dozen regional library chess programs, and took legal action to safeguard scholastic players and tournaments from predatory organizer practices. CCO uses tournament proceeds and your donations to fund these and future efforts.
