## Bugbee Chess Team Finishes Thirteenth in K-6 Open at Nationals

From May 6 through May 8, 2016, the Bugbee chess team travelled to Nashville, Tennessee to participate in the 2016 National Elementary School Championships. After a hard fought seven round battle in the competition's most difficult section, the K-6 Championship (open) group, the team captured 13<sup>th</sup> Place.

The four player Bugbee team competed with only one player rated above 1000 at the outset of the event. Bugbee third grader, Jake Lumelsky, won three games, scoring 3.5 overall, and was awarded first place in the 800-899 rating class within the K-6 open.

Bugbee was the only Connecticut public school team to compete at this tournament. In fact, Bugbee is the first Connecticut public school since 2006 to participate at K-6 Nationals. In 2006, Bedford Middle School (Westport), competed with a team of two sixth graders, finishing 17<sup>th</sup> in the K-6 open.
