On April 2, 2016, 58 players competed in the 2016 Inaugural Connecticut State Scholastic Blitz Chess Championships held at the Farmington Main Library, Farmington, Connecticut.

The tournament was co-sponsored by the Connecticut Chess Organization, the Farmington Libraries, allClubs Chess, and the University of Connecticut Chess Club.

The tournament was organized as a non-profit fundraiser for scholastic chess programs by the Connecticut Chess Organization. The championships raised over \$500 for 2016-17 school year scholastic chess programs.
