New Britain Chess Club

NEW BRITAIN — The 51<sup>st</sup> Annual New Britain Chess Club Championship is taking place on Tuesday evenings through May 29. Rounds begin at 7:30 p.m. at The Quartette Club, 225 Wooster St.

More Chess Club news: National chess master Edward McHugh of West Suffield gave a simultaneous exhibition April 24 at the Quartette Club. McHugh played against 23 central Connecticut area chess players. He deafeated 18 of the players, lost two games and drew with three other players. Robert Kozlowski of New Britain, a graduate student at CCSU, was the first player to defeat the master and was awarded a chess book donated by the NBCC. Joseph Hladun of Wethersfield was the other winner. Jason Lenore, 14, of West Hartford, and John Baclawski and Arkadijs Strazdins of New Britain drew with McHugh.

The next simultaneous exhibitions at the NBCC will be performed by national senior chess masters Nelson Castaneda of New Britain on Aug. 28 and Richard Bauer of Wolcott on Sept.

Arkadijs Strazdins' name appears in the U.S. Chess Federation Rating List for April 2001 in a listing "The Nation's Top Players." Strazdins, 78, is ranked 41<sup>st</sup> in the category of Top U.S. 50 over 65.

New Britain Chess Club

NEW BRITAIN - Mark Wilkin of Seymour is the winner of the 36th annual New Britain Summer Open Chess Championship. The event ended Aug. 7 at the Quartette Club with 33 players from Connecticut, two from Massachusetts and one from Colorado participating. Four players tied for second place. They were Dennis Tortora of Waterbury, Gary Caruso of Farmington, Josef Madej of Unionville and Arkadijs Strazdins of New Britain. Other prize winners were: Top Class - A: William Grzeciak of Cheshire. B: Anthony Diaz of West Hartford, John Pasco of New Britain and William Dworski of New Britain. C: Alan Watrous of Wallingford, Peter Galazan of New Britain, Robert Kozlowski of New Britain. D: William Soto of Middletown, Jose Rodriguez of Stratford, Andris Strazdins of New Britain. Unrated - Bruce Feiedland of Simsbury. A chess book was awarded to Robert Yelle of Ellington for upsetting 32 times New Britain City Chess Champion Arkadijs Strazdins in the first round. Strazdins is rated 496 USCF points above Yelle. National chess master Edward McHugh of West Suffield and chess expert Harris Appelman of Hartford are cochampions of the 2001 Connecticut State Open Blitz (5 minute games) Championship, played Aug. 14 at the Quartette Club. F.I.D.E. master Richard Bauer of Wolcott was third. The Connecticut State Chess Assn., and the New Britain Chess Club were co-sponsors of the tournament. It was directed by Arkadijs Strazdins.

## New Britain Chess Club Annual Meeting Minutes for June 12, 2001

- Opening: The meeting was started at 7:35 pm this evening the 12th of June 2001 with 32 members in attendance.
- President's Comments: The president of the club, Arkadijs Strazdins 78, gave a short story of the last sixty years, going back to war and post war years (WWII) and coming to America and his desire to promote chess not putting any energy into politics but into chess. Also, after 31 years of service as president of the chess club, he announced his retirement from the presidency primarily due to declining health.
- Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer gave a short report on the financial health of the club.

  Basically the treasury has a carryover of \$1,296.00 from the previous chess year with income of \$2,712.00 and expenses of \$1,411 for a net gain of \$5.00 bringing the new total to \$1,301.00
- Minutes (from last annual meeting): The minutes from the June 13 2000 meeting were read by secretary Joseph Mansigian and approved without correction by a 100% unanimous vote.

#### Elections of officers

- President: John Pasco was nominated by Joseph Mansigian for President of the chess club.
  With no other nominations, the secretary casts one vote for the election of <u>John Pasco</u> to become the new President of the New Britain Chess Club!
- Vice President: Joseph Mansigian was nominated by John Pasco for the office of Vice President. With no other nominations, the secretary casts one vote for the election of Joseph Mansigian to the position of Vice President.
- Secretary: Carl Heinemann was nominated to the position of Secretary. There were no other nominations, so the secretary casts one vote for the election of Mr. Carl Heinemann to the position of Secretary.
- Treasurer: Andris Strazdins the current and long standing treasurer, was nominated by Mr. Milardo for the position of Treasurer. With no opposition the secretary casts one vote for the election of Andris Strazdins to the position of Treasurer.
- TD's Tournament directors are based on those who qualify (by the USCF) to be tournament directors. It is not a voting position. The current tournament directors are Arkadijs Strazdins local, since 1952, John Pasco local, Alan Watrous local, Carl Heineman local and Robert R. Kozlowski club.

TC's Team Captains can be anyone who arranges for a match.

#### Dues

A new dues structure was voted in by the membership. Basically there will be a \$5.00 increase in membership dues, so that the dues structure will look as the following:

- President Emeritus Mr Karl Kochman motioned for the creation of a new permanent
  position to be called PRESIDENT EMERITUS and that it should be awarded to the
  outgoing President, Arkadijs Strazdins, as an honorary position to last for the rest of his
  life. The motion was seconded by Mr. Heineman. After a time of explanation and
  discussion the motion was approved by a unanimous vote.
- Benefits to President Emeritus There was a motion by Joseph Mansigian and seconded by John Pasco to have all club dues and fees waived for the President Emeritus. This motion was passed unanimously in a voice.
- Recognition Bill Greziak was recognized for his work on behalf of the chess club in placing the NBCC on the WEB - the world wide web - (www).
- Recognition Robert Kozlowski was recognized for two things:
  - a. His great amount of work as one of the tournament directors and
     b. His serving in the position of NBCC Librarian.

Note - that the position of Librarian is open.

5. Smoking Resolution - This issue drew a long and sometimes almost heated discussion about a topic that has to do with people's right - the right to have a smoke free environment and the right to smoke. Since the sponsoring club has frowned on our club imposing such a rule in 'their' building there was a resolution drafted tonight to 'let it be known that due to the sentiments of the majority of the members of the NBCC, that be it resolved that members should refrain from smoking within the meeting room and should make an effort to go outside when desiring to smoke'. Note-takers comment - This resolution will not be binding as a firm rule or 'law' but will give members the right to remind smoking members that the resolution was passed and they should as of their own free will smoke 'outside' to conform to the wishes of the majority.

Closing: There was a motion to close the meeting at 8:50 pm. It was seconded and approved.
