Again, Seasons Greetings and Happy New Year. Membership is now at 69.

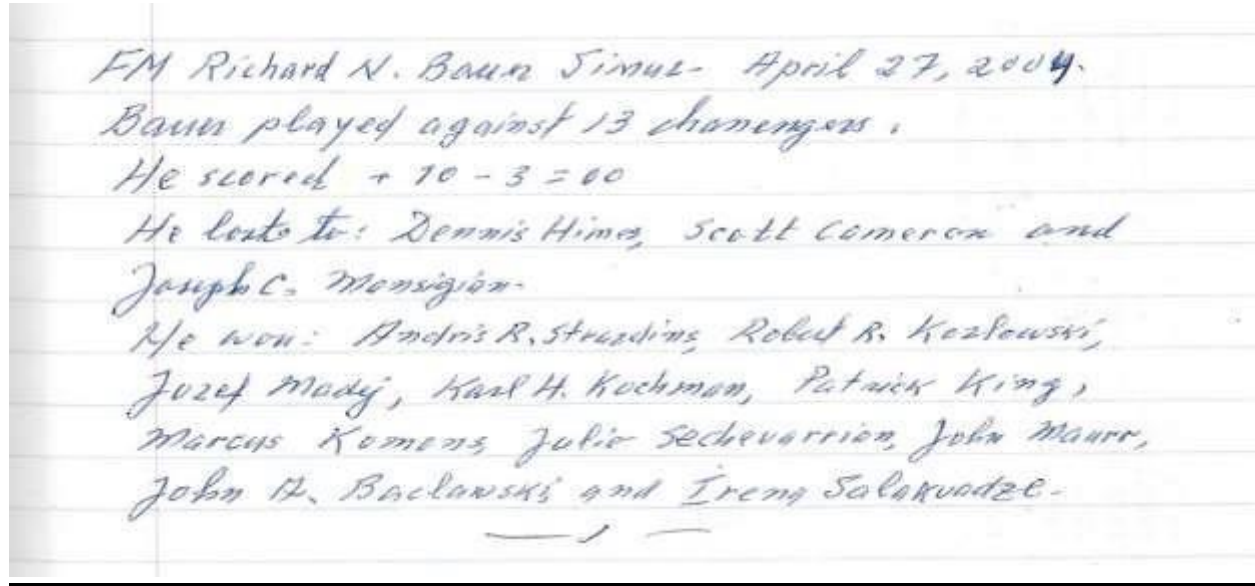

2004 New Britain City Chess Championship Finals

The tournament was won by **Sarathi Ray** of Newington with a score of 8/9. In second place was **Joe Bihlmeyer** of Southington at 6.5/9, and tied for third with 5/9 were **Mark Bourque** of Stafford Springs, **John Baclawski** of New Britain, and **Joe Mansigian** of New Britain.



The results are in for the **2004 (54th Annual) New Britain Chess Club Championship**. The winner and crowned the 2004 NBCC Champion is FIDE Master Nelson Castaneda who scored 4½-½ on his way to claiming 1st place. Nelson was awarded \$100. It should also be mentioned that Nelson is currently playing in a tournament in Vermont and according to his son Andres, Nelson has an opportunity to obtain, from this event, his third and final IM NORM! We wish him the best in obtaining the title of International Master.

Commanding a solid second place in the club championship with an outstanding performance was Andres Castaneda who scored 4-1. He was awarded \$70 last Tuesday night for his place prize. In addition, Andres won the BIGGEST UPSET prize (\$15) for his victory against Mark Bourque in Round 4. The rating differential between Castaneda and Bourque at the time of the match was 317 points!

Tied for 3rd place and TOP Class A prizes were the following players: Bill Grzesiak, David Aldi, and Joe Bihlmeyer. They each earned 3½ points and were presented with \$25.

Tony Diaz and Karl Kochman both tied for the TOP Class B prize with each scoring 3-2 and winning \$25.

Claiming the class C prize solo was Bill Dworski. Dworski won \$25 and scored 3-2.

Subject : Mark Wilkin, Tony Diaz crowned Summer Open co-champions!!!

Greetings fellow members:

Listed below are the final results of the 39th ANNUAL NEW BRITAIN SUMMER OPEN CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP.

Tied for 1st and 2nd place are Mark Wilkin and Tony Diaz who won equal shares of 1st (\$100) and 2nd (\$80) place prizes – equaling \$90 each). They each scored 4.5 points on their way to victory. Congratulations to co-champions Mark and Tony!! (see note below on prize allocation).

Not far behind and tied for third place (\$60) and TOP Class A (\$30) prizes were David Aldi and Joe Bihlmeyer. They each won \$45 and won 4 games. (see note below on prize allocation).

There was a three way tie for the TOP Class B prize. Marcus Komons, Chris Jensen, and Owen Walsh each scored 3-2 and won equal shares of both TOP Class B and Second TOP Class B prizes (\$30+\$30) arriving at \$20 for each prize winner.

Finally, winning the class C prize solo was Yogesh Raghunathan. He scored 3 points and won \$30. He will be awarded the "Biggest Upset" prize for his victory against Ron Bourassa in Round 4, a rating difference of 312 points!

All prize money WILL BE AWARDED NEXT TUESDAY, AUGUST 3, the same night that FIDE Master Nelson Castaneda is scheduled to give a simultaneous exhibition. The entry fee is \$4, \$1 discount for students and seniors over 65.

Again, congratulations to all prize winners and thanks to all 29 players partaking in this annual summer event.

Quick reminder from Andris Strazdins, Treasurer → he wanted me to remind members that **club dues must be paid by September 1**. So if you have not paid yet, please do so within the next month. Thanks.

A side note regarding prize distribution

It should be noted that prizes for TOP Class A (\$30) and TOP Class B (\$30) were not included in the pool when allocating the prizes for Diaz (a Class B player) and Wilkin (a Class A player) because per USCF rule 32B3 "No more than one cash prize shall go into the pool for each winner." In this scenario, both Diaz and Wilkin (2 players) were tied for more than 2 prizes (in essence, 4 prizes) 1st place, 2nd place, Top Class A and Top Class B and not eligible for the class prizes. Therefore, only equal shares of 1st and 2nd place prizes were granted to Diaz and Wilkin. Whereas, in the scenario with Aldi and Bihlmeyer (2 players), they were tied for only 2 prizes – 3rd place (\$60) and TOP Class A (\$30). Both place and class prizes were pooled and allocated accordingly, with each winner receiving \$45. I hope this clarifies any confusion.

The 2004 New Britain City Chess Championship Qualifying tournament is over and the results are in. The 12 players qualified to compete in the New Britain City Finals event starting in late January are:

From Section A: Bill Grzesiak (6.5), Andres Castaneda (6.5), and Jozef Madej (5)

From Section B: Joe Bihlmeyer (6 - won all games!), John Baclawski (3.5), and Marcus Komons (2.5)

From Section C: David Aldi (5), John Mauro (5), and Daniel Rozosky (5)

From Section D: Douglas Fiske (6 - won all games!), Dennis Himes (5), and Tony Diaz (4)

Special mention: Unfortunately, John Chapman, who automatically qualified from Section B winning 4 games, is unable to play in the Finals. As such, the next highest scorer, Marcus Komons will advance.

Players not qualifying will automatically be registered to play in the City Reserve tournament held concurrently with the Finals. Remember: there is no additional entry fee for either the Finals or Reserve tournaments!

Even though monetary prizes are not awarded for the qualifying event, we usually award a prize for the biggest upset (300 or greater rating points) if such an upset occurs. This prize goes to Daniel Rozosky (USCF rating 1407) who claimed victory against one of the club's strongest players, David Aldi (USCF rating 1916). The point difference, albeit very large, is surprisingly not a club record for the biggest upset, which if my memory serves me correct, was over 800 in a match against George Himes and a Class C or B player a few years ago. For Daniel's upset, he will receive \$15. On a side note, Daniel, our newest and now youngest club member being only 8 years old, is quite the chess prodigy. **Per the October 2004 rating supplemental listing, Daniel is ranked seventh for his age group in the United States, an amazing achievement.**

ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 21, THE NBCC WILL HOST THE 2004 CONNECTICUT STATE OPEN BLITZ CHAMPIONSHIP. THE EVENT IS BEING CO-SPONSORED WITH THE CONNECTICUT STATE CHESS ASSOCIATION. PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED TO THE NBCC BY CSCA PRESIDENT JIM CELONE TO HOST THIS EVENT.

THE ENTRY FEE FOR THIS STATE TOURNAMENT IS \$15 REGARDLESS OF AGE!

THE FORMAT OF THE TOURNAMENT WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

THE TIME CONTROL IS G/5.

IF THERE ARE 12 OR FEWER PLAYERS IN THIS EVENT, THE FORMAT WILL BE A DOUBLE ROUND ROBIN WITH PARTICIPANTS PLAYING EACH OPPONENT ONCE AS WHITE AND ONCE AS BLACK.

IF THERE ARE MORE THAN 12 PLAYERS IN THIS EVENT, THE FORMAT WILL BE A SINGLE ROBIN ROBIN. COLORS WILL BE DETERMINED BY LOT (E.G. BY FLIPPING A COIN).

ALL RULES RELATING TO BLITZ PLAY MUST BE FOLLOWED, SPECIFICALLY THE TOUCH-MOVE RULE (NOT TOUCH-CLOCK!!). ALL OTHER RULES DICTATING BLITZ PLAY WILL BE ENFORCED PER THE USCF OFFICIAL RULES OF CHESS, 5TH EDITION.

THE CHAMPIONSHIP IS SCHEDULED TO COMMENCE PROMPTLY AT 7:45 TO ACCOMMODATE ALL PLAYERS. PLEASE TRY TO ARRIVE AND REGISTER EARLY. SINCE THIS IS A ONE NIGHT EVENT, THERE IS NO NEED FOR ADVANCE ENTRIES.

Winning all his games and claiming first place was NM Ted McHugh. He won \$68! Congratulations, Teddy!

Coming in second was NM Harris Appelman, winning \$45.

Taking third place was FM Rick Bauer, who won \$34.

The prize for TOP U2000 was a very close race between Joe Bihlmeyer and Andres Castaneda, but in the end, Joe Bihlmeyer edged over Castaneda by only one-half point (9.5 vs. 9). Bihlmeyer received \$34.

The remaining money was equally distributed between the CSCA and the NBCC, the event co-sponsors.

Thanks to all whom participated and very special thanks to CSCA President Jim Celone for allowing our club to host this event again this year and to Rick Bauer, CSCA secretary, for arranging this tournament to be held at the club.

Mr. Strazdins is still recovering at home from his foot surgery he underwent in September. Unfortunately, due to his limited mobility, he is unable to attend club meetings. Everyone wishes Mr. Strazdins a happy holiday season and happy New Year. Mr. Strazdins is expected to be back at the club very soon, perhaps as early as the middle of January and is planning on playing in the NB City Reserve tournament. Best wishes for a speedy recover Mr. Strazdins and Merry Christmas from everyone at the club.
